#### NCC Draft Code of Professional Conduct for Ecological Consultants

#### Geoff Winning

The Nature Conservation Council of NSW recently released for comment a draft code of professional conduct to which it hoped ecological consultants would subscribe. This draft appears to have been prepared with little or no consultation with any practicing ecological consultants. It made some idealistic (and perhaps naive) statements about the role of consultants. The ECA made a submission to NCC advising that we considered that any code of conduct or ethics needed to be prepared with full involvement of practicing ecological consultants. ECA further indicated its intent to work on such a code and invited contact with NCC on this matter.

## Profile: ECA Treasurer & Public Officer Geoff Winning

Geoff Winning is one of the small group of ecological consultants that initiated the formation of ECA, and is currently the Treasurer and Public Officer.

Early in high school, after reading a book on atoms, Geoff decided he would be a nuclear physicist, and kept this ambition until actually entering university where he discovered ecology. From this time, it was clear that he would end up in a career in ecology, but not straight away.

This was the early seventies and Geoff had visions of dropping out and joining a commune on the north coast. While reluctant to leave the comforts of city (Newcastle) life for a rough life in a commune, the urging did result in him not completing the science degree he had started, and drifting between jobs for a number of years. These jobs ranged from gardening to public service clerk (there seemed to be plenty of public service jobs back then).

Eventually, Geoff decided to finish his studies and, after a few false starts, completed an Associate Diploma in Environmental Studies at Mitchell College of Advanced Education in 1985. This was followed by a Graduate Diploma in Environmental Management in 1988.

At about this time, an organisation known as Shortland Wetlands Centre was established to manage a degraded wetland site for educational and tourist purposes. Geoff was in the right place at the right time to become the first employee of SWC in 1986, and remained working there for 10 years. During this time he became increasingly involved in ecological consultancy in addition to responsibilities in managing the SWC site.

In early 1997 Geoff left SWC to start up his own small business specialising in wetland ecology, but also working in management of other ecosystems. He is also a part-time teacher with Hunter Institute of Technology where he mainly teaches subjects in the new Diploma in Natural Resources Management, including Aquatic Science, Statistics, Plant Identification and Animal Identification. Geoff has found teaching to be rewarding and it now occupies up to half of his time. He also likes to get the students involved in real research projects, and was instrumental in establishing the Centre for Coastal Wetlands Management as a focus for student involvement in wetlands research.



#### **Objectives of ECA**

- To represent practicing ecological consultants in NSW
- To liaise with regulatory authorities and other bodies on matters relevant to the practice of ecological consultants in NSW
- To co-operate with other bodies or organizations and institutions both within Australia and overseas having objects in part or similar to the objects of the Association.

### Membership Information

Membership of the Association is open to any person who is:

- An ecological consultant;
- Employed in an occupation relevant to ecological consultancy;
- Training in disciplines relevant to ecological consultancy;
- In sympathy with the objects of the Association, and;
- Willing to comply with the objects of the Association.

Members may be elected to membership of the Association as either practicing members, nonpracticing members or student members where:

- practicing members shall comprise ecological consultants;
- non-practicing members shall comprise people other than practicing members and students;
- Student members shall comprise students training in disciplines relevant to ecological consultancy but are not practicing ecological consultants.

All interested persons are invited to join the Association. A membership application is appended to this newsletter for this purpose. Attendees at the meeting at The Australian Museum (who paid \$10) can sign membership forms. Council has set membership fees at \$160 for the 12-month period ending 30 June 2000.

#### Annual General Meeting

The first annual general meeting of the Ecological Consultants Association of NSW Inc. will commence at 3:00 pm on Tuesday 16 November 1999 in the upstairs room of the Blue Gum Hotel at the corner of Pacific Highway and Unwin Road Waitara. This location was chosen as it is reasonably central for the bulk of ECA's membership.

The meeting will comprise brief reports from the president and treasurer, followed by the election of president, vice president, treasurer and secretary, and up to ten ordinary Councillors. Nominations for these positions need to be made in writing, signed by two 'practising members', and lodged with the secretary by 16 October 1999.

Note that only 'practising members' whose subscriptions are up to date are entitled to vote. A 'practising member' is a person who is a practising ecological consultant and has been endorsed as a practising member by the Council. All memberships received to date fall into this category.

The meeting will be followed by an informal gathering in the bar to discuss matters of mutual interest, or non workrelated matters if you wish.
